Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ:

We have been waiting a long time, but the implementation of On Mission For the Church Alive! began officially this past Monday, October 15. Not only have I been eager to get the ball rolling. Our priests and you, our faithful, have also expressed the desire to do so as well.

Over the past months, since the announcement in late April of the parish groupings and clergy assignments, we have been flooded with many responses, many good and some angry. People have expressed misunderstanding about the reasons for On Mission. With the release of the Grand Jury report, additional stress was felt by many who looked to the priests they know to help them deal with their emotions. Our priests were also under pressure, trying to continue to serve the pastoral needs of current assignments, as they began to plan and prepare for future ones.

I am grateful to all of my brother priests and deacons who are facing this time with great faith. They have so generously said “yes” to new assignments and to additional assignments. For many of you, you will have the opportunity to welcome new priests in your grouping. I know you will do so warmly. For some of you, your priests remain but take on new responsibilities. I know you will continue to support them.

On Mission, is, at its heart, about a renewal of the Church of Pittsburgh to its very core. As we go forward together, we all need to realize that not everything will be perfect. But most important of all, it is about each of us deepening our relationship with Jesus Christ, and growing in our commitment to serve Him from the heart as we also welcome each other more as our sisters and brothers. We must be engaged in this important work together.

We need to see the changes at hand as a way to accomplish a deeper relationship with Jesus and a closer relationship with each other. Changes are difficult. For some, the loss of a beloved priest seems unfair. But in the desire to offer every corner of the diocese a chance to soar, our priests have said “yes” to going where their particular talents and skills are needed. We continue to invoke the guidance of the Holy Spirit in this moment and in the months and years ahead. As the implementation phase unfolds, there will be opportunities for people to come together in new ways and to explore what it means to be a family of faith. As the Church of Pittsburgh, we are On Mission to be the Church Alive! It is a new day.

Wishing you the peace that comes from knowing Jesus as your friend, I ask you to remember me in your prayers as I promise to do the same for you.
