A MESSAGE FROM FATHER KEVIN MASS INTENTIONS

With fewer Masses throughout the diocese (which will most-likely be the trend for the foreseeable future), the situation pertaining to the backlog of Mass intentions needs to be dealt with appropriately.

At St. Paul Church, we have 172 Mass intentions already scheduled, with 432 Mass intentions yet to be scheduled, dating back to 2015! At St. Michael the Archangel, there are 155 Mass intentions yet to be scheduled (backlog); at St. Andrew the backlog is 50 Mass intentions; at St. Peter the backlog is 30 Mass intentions; at St. Fidelis, the backlog is 28 Mass intentions.

In order to reduce this backlog, we will begin to do the following, as recommended by diocesan personnel, in accordance with church law:

- Schedule two Mass intentions per Mass except for the 'Pro Populo' (For the Parishioners Mass each Sunday). We will do our best to 'double up' Mass intentions at the parish (es) where the request was made before checking with another parish in our grouping about adding an intention to an already scheduled Mass.
- Schedule more Mass intentions for Masses celebrated at local nursing homes, Butler Catholic School, and Butler County Prison.
- 'Give' Mass intentions to priests who oftentimes celebrate Mass privately, i.e. retired priests, or priests not assigned to a parish, like Fr. Phil Farrell, our regional vicar.

We will do our best to communicate the date and time of the Mass to those of you who have offered a Mass intention for a deceased loved one via our bulletins. You may also call the respective parish office requesting such information.

To minimize this situation from happening in the future, beginning on March 1, 2019, we need to limit the number of Mass intentions offered through December 31, 2019, to the following:

- One Sunday (including Saturday Vigil Mass) intention per person/family at the parish where you are registered.
- Two weekday Mass intentions (including Saturday morning) per person/family at the parish where you are registered.

We realize that adjustments will need to be made throughout this process, and ask for your patience as we strive to serve you.

Please know that we always pray for the souls of our deceased loved ones (priests and lay alike, at every Mass), regardless of whether or not we pray for an 'official' intention. The origins of paying for Mass intentions date back to the early church, and was intended to help pay for the material necessities of the Mass. and for the material needs of the priest before they drew salaries. Today, at least in our diocese, regardless of the number of Masses a priest celebrates in one day, he is permitted to receive the \$10 stipend for one Mass only. Any 'excess' money from Mass intentions is sent to the diocese to support the education of seminarians (men studying for the priesthood). Therefore, the collection of money for Mass intentions is to help offset the costs inherent with the temporal needs of the church.

I once heard from a gentleman, speaking in deliberate fashion, with a distinct, classy Italian accent, say in reference to a deceased loved one: "Ten Masses....it will take ten Masses to get her to heaven." He then 'purchased' ten Masses for her.

What?!

This statement isn't exactly the most accurate theological interpretation of Mass intentions, and it wasn't totally this man's fault; it is what he was taught, or at least the perception he had.

We cannot purchase or earn our way (or anyone's way) into heaven. We cannot earn God's grace. We receive it as a gift of love!

By the way, the gentleman attributed to the aforementioned comment was my late Uncle Tony! The woman he was speaking of was his wife.

As always, I pray for all of you daily, and I thank you for all of your prayers, love, and support.
